

## *Easy critical*

This booklet provides entertaining, **easy-to-use critical** thinking activities to supplement the existing writing program. The activities emphasize real-life communication skills. *Real life* can be a controversial term. Some people use it as a value judgement to describe "productive" activities, specifically jobs or the support of one's family. However, many speakers use the phrase in an ironic sense to describe an alternative to their own activities, which may be valued as more important[citation needed]. What we now refer to as "World War I" was originally called *The War to End All Wars*; this is an example of historical irony. Historical irony is therefore a subset of cosmic irony, but one in which the element of time is bound up. The

measurement of time is so critical to the functioning of modern societies that it is coordinated at an international level. The basis for scientific time is a continuous count of seconds based on [atomic clocks](#) around the world, known as the [International Atomic Time \(TAI\)](#). The Egyptians had subdivided daytime and nighttime into twelve hours each since at least 2000 **before** the birth of Jesus **Christ**. Followers of Jesus became known as Christians because they believed that Jesus was the Christ. The Followers of the Light were members of an alien race, the [Lumina](#), who came to Earth eons ago in the Jurassic period to wage the Great Chaos Wars with Earth's alien conquerors, the [Myndai](#). After the last Myndai on Earth were defeated and cast into suspended animation, the Followers of the Light remained on Earth in suspended animation in case the Myndai awoke and restarted the war.

**Animation** is the rapid display of a sequence of images of 2-D artwork or model positions in order to create an illusion of movement. It is an **optical illusion of motion** due to the phenomenon of **persistence of vision**, and can be created and demonstrated in a number of ways. **Rotoscoping** is a technique, patented by **Max Fleischer** in 1917, where animators trace live-action movement, **frame** by frame. The source film can be directly copied from actors' outlines into animated drawings. An example of traditional animation is a horse animated by **rotoscoping** from **Edward Muybridge's** 19th century photos. In **1874**, still living in the San Francisco Bay Area, Muybridge discovered that his wife had a lover, a Major Harry Larkyns. On **October 17**, 1874, he sought out Larkyns; said, "Good evening, Major, my name is Muybridge and here is the answer to the letter you sent my wife"; and shot and killed him.

Muybridge thought his wife's son had been fathered by Larkyns (although, as an adult, the young man bore a remarkable resemblance to Muybridge). He was put on trial for the killing, but acquitted of the killing on the grounds that it was "[justifiable homicide](#)." The inquiry interrupted the horse photography experiment.

*Pardon the Interruption* (abbreviated *PTI*) is a [sports television show](#) that airs weekdays on various [ESPN TV channels](#), [TSN](#), [NASN](#), [XM](#), and [Sirius satellite radio](#) services, and as a downloadable podcast. The longevity and popularity of this show has led to numerous [running jokes](#) between hosts [Michael Wilbon](#) and [Tony Kornheiser](#) that longtime viewers recognize. Kornhesier will sometimes address the audience with either "brothers from another mother" or "sisters from another mister". Audience members participate in different ways in different kinds

of art; some events invite overt audience participation and others allowing only modest **clapping** and **criticism** and **reception**. **Criticism** in general terms means democratic judgment over the suitability of a subject for the intended purposes, as opposed to the authoritarian command, which is meant as an **absolute** realization of the authority's will, thus not open for debate. Indiscriminate clapping is widely considered a violation of **classical music concert etiquette**. Well-recognized politicians or actors often receive applause as soon as they first appear on stage, even before delivering their speech or speaking their first lines. This accolade is given to indicate admiration for his or her past achievements, and is not a response to the performance the audience is attending. The **past** is the portion of the **timeline** that has already occurred; it is the opposite of the **future**. It is also contrasted with the **present**.

According to [presentism](#), the past doesn't *exist*, but all sciences study virtually the world's past, more or less far. Humans have recorded the past since ancient times, and to some extent, one of the defining characteristics of human beings is that they are able to record the past, recall it, remember it and confront it with the current state of affairs, thus enabling them to plan accordingly for the future, and to theorise about it as well.

The phrase "no future", the closing refrain of the Sex Pistols song "[God Save the Queen](#)", became emblematic of the punk rock movement, although its use in the song was ambiguous, the lyrics claiming that "there is no future in England's dreaming". The song was covered by [Anthrax](#) on their *Armed and Dangerous* EP in 1985, and by [Motörhead](#) on their *We Are Motörhead* album, and as a [single](#) in 2000. Part of the song was played by the [Foo](#)

**Fighters** in the 2007 MTV Europe Music Awards. It was also covered by **Bathory** on their final box set. As early as 1984, because of its visibility as a promotional tool for the **recording industry**, MTV became criticized for excessive pornographic references[*citation needed*]. When sexual acts are performed for a live audience, by definition it is not pornography, as the term applies to the depiction of the act, rather than the act itself.

### *Problems with actors*

The word acting is derived from the Latin word *agere* meaning "to do", this is precisely what acting is. The **actor** is said to be "assuming the **role**" of another, usually for the benefit of an **audience**, but also because it can bring one a sense of artistic satisfaction or problems.

A **problem** is an obstacle which makes

it difficult to achieve a desired goal, objective or purpose. It refers to a situation, condition, or issue that is yet unresolved. In a broad sense, a problem exists when an individual becomes aware of a significant difference [between](#) what actually is and what is desired. The time it takes to solve a problem is a way of measuring complexity. Time is also of significant social importance, having economic value as well as personal value, due to an awareness of the limited time in each day and in human lifespans. *Time Is Money* is the second album by [Hip-Hop](#) artist [Styles P](#) of [D-Block](#). It was scheduled to be released on November 14, 2006. But according to D-Block President Supa Mario, the album was not coming out when it was supposed to due to "more problems at the label ([Interscope](#))". The album was released on December 19th.

Many university lecturers discourage students from citing any encyclopedia in academic work, preferring primary sources; some specifically prohibit Wikipedia citations. Although case citations are formatted differently in different jurisdictions, they generally contain the same key information. The Key returns in *JLA* #8 (August 1997), after spending years in hibernation. Master animator Richard Williams urges animators to "**KISS**" (*acronym* for "Keep It Simple, Stupid"). Common variants of the acronym include: "Keep It Sweet & Simple", and "Keep It Short & Simple". The form "Keep It Simple, Silly" is sometimes used in situations (for example, explaining the phrase to children) where "stu-

pid" is too harsh. Stupid!, a comedy television series for children in the [UK](#), broadcast first on [CBBC](#), then on [BBC One](#), has been criticized for its use of the word "damn" and is created and written by Dean Wilkinson.

### *Creationism was not invented in Europe*

**Creationism** is the belief that humanity, life, the [Earth](#), and the universe were created in their entirety by a supernatural deity (typically God), *the existence of which is presupposed*, but creationism can also refer to origin beliefs in general, or to an alternative of traducianism, which is a doctrine about the origin of the soul, in one of the biblical uses of word to mean the immaterial aspect of man.

*Traducianism* means that this immaterial aspect is transmitted through natural generation along with the body, the material aspect of man. i.e. an indivi-

dual's soul is derived from the souls of the individual's parents. This implies that only the soul of Adam was created directly by God (with Eve's substance, material and immaterial, being taken from out of Adam), in contrast with creationism (immediate divine creation), which holds that all souls were so created.

The soul, according to many religious and philosophical traditions, is a self-aware ethereal substance unique to a particular living being. In these traditions the soul is thought to incorporate the inner essence of each living being, and to be the true basis for sentience. It is believed in many cultures and religions that the soul is the unification of one's sense of identity. In distinction to spirit which may or may not be eternal, souls are usually considered to be immortal and to exist before their incarnation in *flesh*<sup>[citation needed]</sup>.

Immortality (or eternal life) is the

concept of living in physical or spiritual form for a *potentially infinite length of time*. What form an unending or indefinitely-long human life would take, or whether the soul possesses immortality, has been the subject of much [speculation](#), [fantasy](#), and debate.

*Fantasy is a situation imagined by an individual or group, which does not correspond with reality but expresses certain desires or aims of its creator.* But fantasy is also another name for Gamma-hydroxybutyrate, a date-rape drug. **Gamma-Hydroxybutyric acid** is a therapeutic drug, an illegal drug, and a naturally occurring substance found in the central nervous system, [wine](#), [beef](#), small citrus fruits and almost all other living creatures in small amounts.

In a medical setting, GHB is used as a general anesthetic, to treat conditions such as insomnia, clinical depression, narcolepsy, and alcoholism, and to improve *athletic performance*. It is also

used illegally under the street names Juice or Liquid Ecstasy, either as an intoxicant, or as a [date rape drug](#). As well, the human body's cells naturally produce GHB. GHB is structurally related to the ketone body beta-hydroxybutyrate. As a drug it is used most commonly in the form of a salt. GHB is also produced as a result of [fermentation](#) and so is found in small quantities in some beers and wines.

A small amount of material is released onto the two dimensional medium which leaves a visible mark.
